It was the "Rog and Missy show" with a lot of help from VP Nancy O'Bosky. who was unable to attend but had prepared forms and sign-up sheets for everything from new member applications to volunteer opportunities to lead worship, testimonies, man the booth on The Row and so on. Our prayer was a simple one; Father, HELP!! Little did we know what our Great Provider was going to do. **Philippians 4:19** "And my God shall supply all your needs according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus."

We arrived Saturday morning with empty tanks and full water only to find we had full hook-ups in a beautiful grassy campground of over a thousand spaces and a few trees, which is part of the Missouri State Fair Grounds. Four RV's were placed around in a cross formation so no one was next to each other's bedroom. Church was scheduled for 1:00 PM on Sunday, so we ran from the booth to the building set apart for our worship. We knew we needed a song leader & some testimonies so during the service Roger asked for volunteers. Little did we know that He had provided the very best guitar player, singer & leader of worship in Barb Maxey who would start leading worship Monday morning. Each day, even through the rain most mornings at 7 a.m. Barb led us into the presence of the Lord.

Here are my thoughts—written for Dad’s and Grandpa’s but also for Mom’s and Grandma’s

Preparing Young Hearts

At this time of the year many of you Dad’s have been out in the garden preparing the soil for planting seed. You have tilled, watered, fertilized, and planted the seed, then watered it more or less regularly and hoed the weeds. Then after many weeks of your hard work you begin to see the fruit on the plants. It all started with the soil preparation.

Our children are like that soil. In **Mat. 13:1-23** Jesus goes into great detail about the “soil of the soul.” The “seed” of course is God’s Word and the soil is our children’s and grandchildren’s hearts. In **vs. 19** the soil on the path is the heart that does not understand God’s Word and the devil takes that away —seed that is not understood. So, parents it is our duty to make sure our kids understand God’s Word.

In **vv. 20-21**, this soil is rocky. It is the child that becomes a Christian and is joyfully involved in church, Sunday school, and youth groups but as they get to later teen years they begin to participate less and the pressure of sin allows them to fall away. We parents need to be very patient, understanding and involved in our teens lives just as much as when they were younger in order to keep them from falling away.

Then in **vs. 22**, this soil has weeds/thorns which are all worries of this life (clothes, cars, boyfriends, girlfriends) and the deceitfulness of wealth (money, \$\$, money). These get a choke hold on our kids and choke the Christian life right out of them—making them unfruitful (not bearing any fruit in their life).

Vs. 23 gives hope—the result of understanding God’s Word producing in them an abundant crop. It produces much fruit in their life. I can’t imagine any Christian parent or grandparent not wanting that fruit for their children.

Hope you’ve had or will have a Happy Mother’s Day, Father’s Day, or Grandparent’s Day. God bless you.

This is my prayer from **Rom. 12:1-2:**

Lord, today I present my body to you as a living sacrifice, may it be holy and pleasing to you.

May I not be conformed to this world today, but please transform me by renewing my mind, so that today I can prove what your will is for my life.
