President's Corner

ARE YOU A PARTY CRASHER?

I'm continually amazed at God's handiwork and His love and of our opportunity to witness.

We don't like to be disturbed from our routine, but we usually don't mind when someone we love crashes our party. I'm thinking this time about those of the world who disturb us—our non-friends, or even our enemies who crash our party. Why does God permit this? Should we, occupied with our Christian duties, bark at them to get out? Recently I heard from a friend in Vietnam that the police came to their home everyday. At Christmas they were singing and having some food. The police recorded everything. One asked why are there so many here? She said- This is our Christmas worship. Then he said - You sing too long...Why do you sing 3 hours? She said - Just let me finish the program. You sit here and have some food while we pray. Then come back tomorrow and arrest us if you want. He said I am recording you. She said - go ahead and I hope you show it to many people. She continued - With Jesus we can love our enemies. We need not fear police but we do fear God. We can suffer persecution but now we have 4 more house churches. Pray that we'll be stronger...

She continued that many Vietnamese soldiers and police crash our party. There are many instances when the arrestors become witnesses to Christians being persecuted as they sing and pray. Yet many Vietnamese Christians feel God is delivering them to their enemy - not from them. They say why would God do this kind of delivery - so that the enemy can crash our party. Most assuredly Satan is attempting to upset the Kingdom. Why should God allow him to invade our space, our right as Christians to witness in our schools, our corporations, or our RV life? How could God play such a cruel trick on us and smear our Norman Rockwell image of America?

This message from Vietnam reminds me of Acts 1:8, after the church was empowered and established, God kicked them out of their nest in Acts 8:1 and forced them to flee into the world—turning the tables by having the believers crash the world's party. I do not wish persecution to come to your home but have you considered what your mission field is and are you ready to meet the enemy when he/she tries to crash your party?

I do want you to know that persecution is all around you and whether it is in Vietnam, China, India, the Middle East, or America many party crashers need to be won to our Lord Jesus Christ by you and me.

We live only a few seconds compared to eternity. Will we have the precious opportunity to share God's grace and the mercy of Christ with the party crashers before they go to meet Him?

Prayer Requests Updates

Editor's Note: The following are medical updates from BOF members. We need to continue to pray as the Lord leads us for all who are going through trying times.

Bill has enjoyed not being out of breath, and he's getting some of his energy back. He now can lift 25 pounds, so he can now lift Pudge (who's 17 pounds), but 25 still is not a lot of weight. He's not taking as many naps since he has more energy. He just has to be careful he doesn't over-extend himself. When you're feeling good it's easy to do just a little bit more, and then wish you hadn't. Now that he's feeling good from the heart surgery, his back is reminding him that is still a problem. Workmen's comp has a physical capacity test they want him to do, but because it was postponed because of his heart problem, they want to get a job description from the bus yard and get it to his cardiologist for approval for the test. I guess the test is somewhat strenuous, and they don't want to be liable if his heart has problems during the test.

Karen had her 4th chemotherapy today, and the doctor said the white blood cell count was so good she didn't need to go in tomorrow for the Neulasta (white cell booster) shot. This was the last double chemo session, and the next session in 2 weeks will be with a single chemical. That session, however, will last about 4 hours - twice the time as what she has been getting. Supposedly that one doesn't have the devastating effect on the white blood cells, so she may not need the Neulasta shot, but time will tell. The other thing is it generally causes bone pain so we'll see how she reacts. She's half-way through the chemotherapy and things have gone quite well so far thanks to all the prayers. Keep up the good work - God is good.

Another answered prayer. This came from my cousin Thad in Arizona regarding his brother in law, Polito.

One would probably have to read about Job in the Bible to find a story about a person who survived so many severe medical problems as Polito has. We are thankful for your prayers, and thoughts, and thankful to be able to send you this good report.

Tuesday, they were able to determine Valley Fever was the cause of Polito's near death situation. He was on 8 antibiotics. They were able to reduce the number to those specific to that problem, and he started to improve.

Wednesday, his oxygen level improved significantly and he was able to breath on his own for the first time in days.

Thursday, they removed all the tubes, and he was completely on his own and after considerable effort was able to beg for lime sherbet. When told he was a fighter, he raised his hand and pointed upward and stared past his finger toward the ceiling and beyond.

Friday morning he is talking and progressing well. He is expected to be able to sit in a chair tomorrow.

Friday again! We don't know how to thank you for your prayers and concern. We know Polito would not be here without the help of friends and people who have sincerely asked God to intervene and bring him through this series of almost unbelievable series of medical emergencies. ABOVE ALL, WE THANK GOD FOR WHAT HE HAS DONE! Our thanks is from the bottom of our hearts.

At World Doctor's Conference, Heart Surgeon Relates Astounding Account of a Resurrection from the Dead

Editor's Note: I was so impressed by the following that appeared in an e-mail we received from Breaking Christian News newsletter, Albany, OR that I wanted everyone to read this fabulous testimony.

"We quickly rushed the gentleman down to the intensive care unit, and the hospital was by now buzzing about the fact that a dead man had been brought back to life. After a couple of days he woke up. He had an amazing story to tell after I had asked him, 'Where have you been and where were you on that day that you had that massive heart attack? You were gone and we prayed you back to life in Jesus name.'"

(MIAMI, FL)—The audience of 120 doctors from 50 countries sat in stunned silence as a renowned heart doctor produced evidence of how, after he had prayed for a patient who had died and was being prepared for the morgue, was brought back to life after prayer. Dr. Chauncey W. Crandall IV, who serves at the Palm Beach Cardiovascular Clinic in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, made his dramatic presentation on Friday, July 13th at the 4th Annual World Christian Doctors Network Conference in Miami, Florida.

He produced dramatic evidence that was shown on the screen and then, afterwards, agreed to tell the story to *Assist News Service* in an interview with Dan Wooding.

The following is the interview as conducted by Dan:

Dr. Crandall began by saying that the dramatic incident took place almost a year ago in West Palm Beach, Florida. "We had a fifty-three year old man who came to the emergency room with a massive heart attack and actually his heart had stopped," he said. "The medical people had worked on him for over forty minutes in the emergency room and then declared him dead.

"They called me in to evaluate the patient towards the end of his treatment where they had unsuccessfully tried to revive him. The nurse was preparing his body to be taken down to the morgue when the Holy Spirit told me to 'turn around and pray for that man.' When the Holy Spirit talks to you, you have to respond. It's sometimes a quiet voice and this was a quiet voice and to honor the Lord I did turn around and I went to the side of that stretcher where his body was being prepared.

"There was no life in the man. His face and feet and arms were completely black with death and I sat next to his body and I prayed, 'Lord, Father; how am I going to pray for this man? He's dead. What can I do?'" All of a sudden, these words came out of my mouth, 'Father, God, I cry out for the soul of this man if he does not know You as his Lord and Savior, please raise him from the dead right now in Jesus name.

"It was amazing as a couple minutes later, we were looking at the monitor and all of a sudden a heart beat showed up. It was a perfect beat; a normal beat; and then after a couple more minutes, he started moving and then his fingers were moving and then his toes began moving and then he started mumbling words.

"There was a nurse in the room—she wasn't a Believer—and she screamed out and said 'Doctor Crandall, what have you done to this patient?'" And I said, 'All I've done is cry out for his soul in Jesus name.'

"We quickly rushed the gentleman down to the intensive care unit, and the hospital was by now buzzing about the fact that a dead man had been brought back to life. After a couple of days he woke up. He had an amazing story to tell after I had asked him, 'Where have you been and where were you on that day that you had that massive heart attack? You were gone and we prayed you back to life in Jesus name.'

"He said, 'Doctor Crandall, it's the most amazing thing. I was in a dark room and there was no light. It was complete darkness and I felt I was in a casket and I kept repeating that I was so disappointed.' He said the disappointment came from the fact that none of his family, friends or colleagues, had come to visit him. Then he told me, 'All of a sudden, these men came in and they wrapped me up and they threw me in the trash.'

"Dan, he was in hell that day and as he told me that story, I cried out, 'Lord, this gentleman needs to accept You as Lord and Savior.' I then explained the salvation message to this man as he sat in that bed and I held his hand and I cried out, 'Father God, in the name of Jesus, I pray that this man accepts you as his Lord and Savior right here in the intensive care unit.' He held out his hand and accepted Christ as his Savior with tears rolling down from his eyes and now he's a child of God.

"I told him, 'You never have to be thrown in the trash into total darkness now. The life of Christ is in you and the light of the kingdom of Heaven is on you now.'"

I asked Dr. Crandall if there had been any brain damage to the patient.

"No there was no brain damage at all; his brain was completely normal," he said. "I was most concerned about his hands because his fingers were completely black and he had some numbness in his fingers and his feet, but now that is totally resolved."

I asked Dr. Crandall if he could give the name of the man and he said he couldn't as the patient had requested that it would not be revealed.

"All I can say is that he was fifty-three years old and he was a car mechanic," he said. "He had a family who were Believers, but he left them twenty years ago because he didn't believe in the Lord. His family continued to pray for twenty years for his salvation, and his ex-wife was on her hands and knees praying for the salvation of her ex-husband, who came to know the Lord that day."

I then asked the doctor if he had seen other similar miracles in his practice.

"I've been witness to three cases of people being raised from the dead," he said. "One other case was when another patient came to the hospital with a massive heart attack. It was on the very day that I received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit and I'd been praying for weeks that I would receive this mighty baptism that the Lord can give us. We were working on this patient that came in again with a massive heart attack and who didn't survive in the operating room.

"All of a sudden, that Baptism of the Holy Spirit hit me and I started speaking in a spiritual language and crying over this patient who, in the operating room theater, had passed away. And then, within five or ten minutes, the heartbeat came back and life came back to this patient. Once again, the nurses who are not Believers looked at me as if to say, 'There goes Doctor Crandall on another case.'"

I concluded the interview by asking Dr. Crandall what he would like to say to doctors who do not believe in supernatural healing.

"I would just like to say to my colleagues and physicians out there, that the Lord is real. We've seen many miracles and we pray for our patients daily. There is not one week that goes by that we don't see a mighty miracle in our office. The people need this; they need the power of Christ in their life and they need the power of Christ for healing.

"I would just encourage my fellow doctors to get involved in a church, meet with a minister, and attend a healing service run by people that believe in the power of Jesus Christ. We love our colleagues in medicine—we pray for them."

Membership Expiration

At the annual business meeting during the Spring Escapade in Chico, CA in April 2006, a discussion was held concerning moving the dues paying dates to the end of each year through which members paid. Accordingly, those members whose dues were paid to April 2006 were given a grace period whereby their dues did not expire until December 31, 2006. All other members' dues were also extended through December 31 of the particular year through which they had paid.
