## Visiting Sedalia, MO

This city has a great history of heritage. Sedalia was founded in 1860 and was a rough western frontier town. It began to boom in 1861 when the Pacific Railroad made its way through the area. The city began booming as it was becoming what was known as the Queen City of the Prairies.

As you tour Sedalia, you will soon discover that it still offers views of her past. The 19<sup>th</sup> century architecture can be seen throughout the city. Any tour of Sedalia is a trip back in time, from its Historic Downtown Business District to the tree-lined

boulevards. You will find that Sedalia is far more than bricks and mortar. Sedalia's Katy Depot is one of the largest depots between Kansas City and St. Louis. It was renovated

by the Department of Natural Resources and houses the Sedalia Chamber of Commerce and the Convention and Visitors Bureau. The depot is located near the center of Sedalia and links the north and south trail heads for the Katy Trail State Park. The Depot serves as an official Welcome Center for visitors. The Railroad Heritage Exhibit located inside the Depot was completed June 2003. Historical buildings serve as exhibit cases that put a face on Sedalia's heart and history. Each building contains information telling of the influence the railroad had on Sedalia. Included in the exhibit are a working telegraph, audio visual theatre, youth activity room and life-size cast figures in the women's waiting room dramatizing life in Sedalia in 1904.

He proved His power is stronger than anything when He walked out of His grave. This is a rescue moment! Don't miss it.
