## From the President

### A Christian Memorial Day?

My devotional time had seemed to become rather stagnant and it seemed to have become a mechanical habit. It was like having the same cereal for breakfast, lunch, and dinner day after day. I had become bored. I also became concerned that my relationship with God was not what it should be. I knew He was there but I couldn't sense His presence like I had in times past. The way I had been having devotional times had been comfortable and at times exciting and now—something was wrong, something was missing. Have you ever been there?

This continued for several months and even brief fellowship times with our Christian Fellowship BOF family first at Casa Grande and later at Campo did not fully restore vibrancy to my devotional times. I began reading a series of books entitled "God's Generals." This is a three-volume series with each volume containing the life and ministry of Christian men and women who have greatly influenced Christianity. Each biography tells about their life; their successes and their failures and their impact on Christianity. "The Roaring Reformers," the second book in the series dealt with the lives of men like Wycliffe, Luther, Knox, Hus, and Fox. My devotional time has not been the same since; the excitement has returned and The Word has become more alive than ever. I have just started the third book of the series which presents the lives of Moody, Wesley Whitfield, Finney, Edwards, and Billy Graham.

A Christian Memorial Day? Why not? Memorial Day is set aside to remember and honor the men and women of our armed forces, law enforcement, and fire departments who have given their lives defending and serving you and me. Have we set aside a time to remember those Christian men and women who suffered and many even laid down their lives so that we might have the awesome privilege of worshiping, praying, and studying The Word? This is a report on the health of a friend of ours, Al Pembroke. Doctors had been trying to determine whether or not he had cancer in his lung.

The doctors performed a bronchoscopy that showed the bronchioles to be clear (no obstruction) which is good but they did discover a tumor in the left upper lung tissue. After a biopsy it was determined that the tumor is cancerous and that it has spread to adjacent lymph nodes.

The surgeon could not remove the entire tumor because it was too large. They sent a piece of it to the lab. The tumor will have to be shrunk before they can remove it entirely so this is something specific to pray for. The tumor is pressing on the right vocal cord nerve causing Al to be hoarse. They kept him in the hospital last night because he was having trouble breathing, but Sylvia thought he would come home today. They also still have to deal with the masses they discovered in Al's groin and femur. Lots of prayer needed.

Al is scheduled to begin chemotherapy and radiation (date not available) to shrink the tumor.

Al was disappointed of course when he heard the report, but he's a fighter and we'll fight with him. We want to thank everyone for your prayers as we continue to pray for his complete healing. Please continue to pray with us.

The doctor thinks she may have swallowed some pollen that may have aggravated her lungs and made the pneumonia worse than it should have been.

It’s never easy getting ready to attend a Christian Fellowship BOF Rally as something always tries to keep us from attending.
