President's Corner

This time I want to relate a couple of illustrations to this message. It seems big changes may be coming to our CF BOF and to many of us as we make our travel plans for the big Gillette, WY Escapade.

One day a preacher was painting his fence. He was thinking about the book of James and about life being so brief. He looked out at the road and saw a man pulling a horse. He said to the man "Where are you going with that horse?" "I'm going to town to sell it." Preacher said "You ought to say you'll sell it if it's the Lord's will." "The Lord's will has nothing to do with it. I raised it to sell and I'm going to sell it." "I'm telling you, life is short and you ought to say if it's the Lord's will." Man said "Look, I raised it to sell and I have an appointment in town with a potential buyer. The Lord's will doesn't have anything to do with it." So off he walked - dragging the horse. Preacher kept painting the fence and about 1 1/2 hours he saw the man coming back. His pants were off, boots gone and he was trying to hide behind his shirttail, his face was cut and his hair a mess.

"What in the world happened to you?" "Well, I talked so long to you that I was late for my appointment so I cut across a corn field to save time. The farmer who owns the field saw my horse, but didn't see me. He shot the horse which fell on me and kicked me in the head. I couldn't get out from under him without pulling off my britches and boots. I got up and the farmer started to shoot at me. I ran and got caught in the barbed wire fence. That's what happened." "Well, what are you going to do now?"

"I'm going home if it is the Lord's will..."

In James 4:13-17, we are told to use caution. When we make plans do we consider what the Lord wants? I will do such and such if it's the Lord's will for me.

Let us consider a couple of points. First, He is affirming the uncertainty of life. Some of you may remember Normandy in 1944. Lots of lives were lost yet many more were saved by the presence of thousands of lightning bugs along the roadside. They served as guides as it was "blackout" on the road. Those bugs made the invasion more successful. I'm sure we could have an interesting discussion about God's part in this. Second, we feel God is ultimately in control of His creation. Some might claim God doesn't care or even exist. We know the Bible is true and His way is best. You've heard of the farmer who had a ewe that gave birth to twins. Shortly one died and the farmer said "I'd rather have one fat lamb than two skinny ones." Then shortly the other died so he said "It's all for the best but I can't figure the Lord out." We can't blame all misfortune on the Lord. Many of us will just sit on the sofa



and whine saying—Why did this happen to me? The Christian faith has been given a bad name by those who just sit and wait for someone else to do it.

We need to be more like Jesus. He was active. Remember Matthew 7:7, "Ask and it will be given you - Seek and ye shall find - Knock and it will be opened to you." No place in the Gospels is there a hint that we as Christians are to sit and wait for others to lead. James wrote an epistle about doing, working, and giving. The Christian life is a life of action - striving and never giving up.

In closing I'm encouraging you to come to our Escapade and get involved with our Christian Fellowship. You'll enjoy it and you will be blessed. Do we really want to do the Lord's will? Please stop by our spot on the Row in Gillette and tell us what you think.

Thanks for all your prayers during my recent back surgery and subsequent rehabilitation period. All has gone very well. I'm still having some pain in the back but not like it was before the surgery. Before the surgery, on the day of my appointment with the neurosurgeon, both my legs gave out and I was unable to walk more than two to three steps at a time using a walker. We count it a miracle that we were able to get in for the surgery before I became completely paralyzed.

Right now I'm in the middle of rehabilitation. I go to water therapy classes twice a week for the next 14 weeks. It seems to really help reduce the pain in my legs. The leg pain is caused by the deterioration of the nerve when it was pinched and it takes quite a while for it to come back. Nurses in the nursing home told me that my back surgery was done just in time to avoid losing the nerves completely.

I'm very fortunate that I have an understanding wife who agrees to do positively everything for me. Since I'm not allowed to bend, lift, twist, push or pull, she's johnny-on-spot to do things for me. I've never been in this type of situation before except for short periods of time when I've had minor illnesses/surgeries, so it's been difficult. I want to be doing things and know I can't. Haven't even driven the truck since January 28th.

I never thought a person's body could go through so much trauma. And, I've discovered that everything a person does is affected in the back. No one can say I have no back bone because I'm very aware that it's there.

I solicit your continued prayers for a more rapid recovery that even the doctor expects because I've got lots of things to do. Until then, we'll spend our time here in the desert of Desert Hot Springs, CA (in spite of the summer heat). Probably eat out a little more often to make use of restaurant air conditioning and spend lots of time of the pool. Thankfully the evenings have been cool, so far.

Pitch-in Group

What's in a Name?

When you say your name, or call your loved one's name, or choose a name for your baby, what significance does that name have? In the Bible all names have a significant character meaning. Ruth means "friendship" or "companion". Remember she stayed and was a friend/companion to Naomi. Naomi means "pleasant", but she later called herself Mara "bitter".

When Moses asks God who he should say told him, God answers with 4 Hebrew letters (Exodus 6.3), commonly called the tetragrammaton (tetra means four and gramma means letter — Webster's New World Dictionary). It is the Hebrew letters, Yud Hay Vav Hay, roughly similar to YHVH. It may seem incredible, but today we don't know how to pronounce that name. God, Himself tells us that we are not to misuse His name, so many people do not even attempt to pronounce God's name because we know anything we say is most likely wrong. We have lost the way to pronounce it, and although we have the letters, we don't have the vowels, and we could be way off in trying any pronouncing....for example, it could be YooHooVooHoo, or YaHaVaHa, or YeeHeeVeeHee, or any combination, so you see it could sound very silly instead of being Holy and right.

Some people say a name starting with J, but we know for a certainty that is wrong because there is no J in the Hebrew alef-bet. In fact, there was no J in English until the 17th century (see "J" in Webster's New World Dictionary). There is a belief that the letter we call vav and we transliterate (write in English) as a V, was originally a waw and should be transliterated W, so some people use a name with a W in the middle. Some say a OOH and AHH sound put together make a sort of W – maybe, but again we don't know for sure, and rather than risk insulting the Most Holy, the God of all creation, we avoid trying to speak that name. Someday, in the world to come, we will learn it, perhaps. For now, the translators have usually used LORD, and in Hebrew we use the word Adonai, for My Lord.

There is great meaning behind those 4 letters; they can stand for "I am, I was, and I shall be". There is a song called Kadosh (Holy) which is straight from Revelation 4.8. The words in Hebrew are, Haya, Ho-vay, v' Yavoh. Y(avo) H(oveh) V H(aya) that's the tetragrammaton! YHVH. In this order it is "who will come, who is, and who was."

But there is something else those four letters can stand for. In a Hebrew lexicon (Ancient Hebrew Lexicon of the Bible, Jeff A. Benner, 2005, Virtualbookworm.com Publishing, Inc., P. O. Box 9949, College Station, TX 77842, pages 100, 107, and 140) you'll find the background of those ancient letters....the Yud (Yavoh) stands for HAND Hay (Haya) stands for BEHOLD Vav (V') stands for NAIL Hay again (Hovay) stands for BEHOLD. HAND BEHOLD NAIL BEHOLD. Of whom does that remind you? (By the way, Jeff Benner and his wife, Denise, and their children, are Escapees members!)

While we avoid trying to pronounce the tetragrammaton, acceptable substitutes for everyday speech, prayer and worship, are Adonai, Elohim, HaShem, The Eternal, The Holy One, Lord, Father, God, etc. When you get very technical about the name references, you will find that some are used consistently where God is shown as a gracious loving father, and others are used where He is shown as a judge, or a strict enforcer.

About the famous names in the New Testament starting with J: Jesus' name is really Yeshua, which means Salvation....there are lots of references in tombs, etc., to a fairly common name of the time, spelled in Hebrew Yud Shin Vav Ayin, similar to our Y-SH-OO-A and pronounced at least close to Ye-shoo-ah. Some stress the Yah-shoo-ah, making it God Saves. One or the other is probably right on! The spelling is right, and the pronunciation may vary slightly. Messianic Jews, who believe in Yeshua as the Messiah, often use the Hebrew term Mashiach, meaning Messiah, or Anointed One, instead of the maybe mispronounced Yeshua.

How did we get Jesus from Yeshua? If you want, I'll give you the Hebrew, to Greek, to Latin, to German, to English translations in the next column, and if you want to know the meaning of the names from Adam to Noah, in one sentence, I'll tell you that next time too. Also, if you want me to give you the meaning of your name, or a name for your baby (grandbaby?), please contact me with the name and I'll include that in the next column.

Meanwhile, Shalom "peace" to you and your household, a very special peace, a completeness, a wholeness, a total wellness, which only God can give.

Membership Expiration

At the annual business meeting during the Spring Escapade in Chico, CA in April 2006, a discussion was held concerning moving the dues paying dates to the end of each year through which members paid. Accordingly, those members whose dues were paid to April 2006 were given a grace period whereby their dues did not expire until December 31, 2006. All other members' dues were also extended through December 31 of the particular year through which they had paid.

To help you remember when your dues expire, those members who receive their newsletter via snail mail, look at your mailing label. On the top line is a year: 2008, 2009, 2010, etc. That indicates that your dues are paid through December 31 of that year.

10. We don't change God's message — His message changes us.
11. The church is prayer-conditioned.
12. When God ordains, He sustains.
