My heart was just filled to overflowing as I saw hands raised in praise and people lifting their hearts to the Lord during the event!

## Christianity 101

John 4:17 *As He is so are we* **IN THIS WORLD**

*Editor’s Note: This is a continuation of the study that was in the August newsletter.*

One of the greatest things you can say about God is that God is. You can’t say that about any other creature.

He always has been, always will be, never changing.

The fact that He never changes and I do change allows me to live as long as He lives.

If He changes, I will not live as long as He lives.

Exodus 3:1-15—Moses had never seen a bush burning before. The bush talked to Moses. Now, Moses had been on the back side of the desert—Who told the bush that his name was Moses?”

Verse 6—God then said, “I am God.”

Verse 11—Then Moses said, “Who am I?”

## Many Thanks

As many of you already know, your editor recently underwent surgery to repair a previous total knee replacement. For a little history, the knee was originally replaced 13 years ago and it never seemed to be right. It gave me fits in that it was always swollen, hot to touch, and painful.

When I saw a new orthopedic surgeon, he was quite taken aback with the swelling and pain that I was told was "pretty normal." His words to me were, "Not in my book." When I saw him on May 31, 2007, he gave me a surgical appointment for September 10, 2007.

Needless to say, having to wait from May 31 to September 10 for the surgery to take place was not a fun time. The anticipation gave me all kinds of mindless scenarios. Even to the point where maybe I would lose my leg (that's how the mind works—always giving you the worst picture).

When he opened up the knee he found that the plastic had worn through and had broken. There was infection in the knee for which I was given antibiotics. He cleaned out all the debris and bad tissue, making it just like an original replacement. A new plastic was installed and the surgery was complete, after suturing and stapling.

After five weeks of physical therapy, the knee has totally recovered, except for residual surgical pain. I have to ice it periodically (every couple of hours) and still take pain medication periodically.

My point in writing this is primarily to let everyone know that when they would see me walking around the Escapades with a limp, the limp was as minimal as I could make it because I didn't want to call attention to myself. As many of you know, I'm one of those people that when given a job to do will do it with all of my being. So I had jobs to do and did them.

I want to thank everyone in the Christian Fellowship BOF for their prayers and words of encouragement. There were many Escapees who contacted me and said they were praying for me and gave me encouragement also. Thanks again.

## Membership Expiration

At the annual business meeting during the Spring Escapade in Chico, CA in April 2006, a discussion was held concerning moving the dues paying dates to the end of each year through which members paid. Accordingly, those members whose dues were paid to April 2006 were given a grace period whereby their dues did not expire until December 31, 2006. All other members' dues were also extended through December 31 of the particular year through which they had paid.

To help you remember when your dues expire, those members who receive their newsletter via snail mail, look at your mailing label. On the top line is a year: 2007, 2008, 2009, etc. That indicates that your dues are paid through December 31 of that year.

For those members who receive their newsletter via e-mail or download it from the website, there is no way of indicating when your dues are expiring other than receiving an e-mail reminder from the Membership Chairman that your dues are about to expire.

Please note that if your dues expire December 31, 2007, this will be your final newsletter and your name will be removed from the BOF active membership database on January 31, 2008 if your renewal is not received by that time.
