News and Views

The following are excerpts from a report from David McQuoid, SKP 90501. He has a traveling ministry involving computers and providing assistance with databases and software to Christian ministries/missions throughout the lower 48 United States.

Along the way, I stopped again in Elkhart Indiana to assist the HCJB World Radio Engineering Center (www.hcjbeng.org). This time the task was to move their parts-and-vendors information into a Fishbowl riding on a Firebird database. The inventory system really is named "Fishbowl" and it does use a database engine named "Firebird" - - I wonder who is leading the trend for 'animal' product names?

Next was YWAM Northwoods (www.ywamnorthwoods.org) near the town of Chetek in northwestern Wisconsin. We began the preparation for installing the YWAM-contacts management system (essentially similar to that used at some other YWAM bases in the USA). However, the staffing situation was too fluid—they need some longer term people—so that was put on hold until new staff arrive.

I was able to assist the person responsible for their website in cleaning up the broken links and inconsistent menus so they have a workable foundation from which to build.

I visited and/or spoke with a couple other ministries that do not yet understand the value of information or that have someone obstructing their growth in this area.

And then I found myself in Cowboy Land—Wyoming. Western Frontiers (www.westernfrontiers.org), also known to many as Cowboys With A Mission, is a YWAM base with Cowboy church and nomadic-peoples focus.

Yes, they ride horses; yes, they put on Rodeo Bible Camps; and, yes, they present a full-blown annual Labor Day Rodeo in the town of Meeteetse, WY. Here we worked through the process for the YWAM-contacts database and installed it with modifications to handle the special information they needed (eg: related to rodeo-bible-camps and the individual events that are part of rodeos).

We also installed the donor module that extends the system to handle complete donation records, receipting, and associated fundraising tools. Western Frontiers is fortunate to have a young staff member who is adept at learning and adopting new accounting tools.

While at Western Frontiers, I was asked by Amy Law (who with her husband Mark are the directors of Western Frontiers) to consider developing a database for the GO Conference (www.go-conference.com) that is an annual meeting for about 800 YWAMers held in Estes Park, Colorado. So we built what should probably be considered a prototype that is now in use for registration and housing assignment. I would not be surprised that some significant changes will be desired before next year—I was not able to be on-site with all the users of this database, thus some of it was speculative in its structure.

I am now in Montana at the Mission Builders International (www.missionbuilders.org) headquarters. It is a great place to regroup with a very being-at-home feeling. Here we have made a few small changes like directly/programmatically emailing receipts and reports to donors.

Please continue to pray for safety on the road, effectiveness in technical service, and funding for both this ministry and the ministries/missions that need the services.

Two specific needs:

- additional ministries ready for database assistance,
- a replacement truck for the faithful-so-far but failing 1985 pickup I am currently using.
